Edito.

'Know thyself' – Socrates made this injunction, inscribed on the pediment of the temple of Delphi, the principle of all wisdom. It implies a certain capacity to distance oneself, to become the object of one's own knowledge. This can of course be understood at different levels. It can be the subject of an analysis or rational introspection through which we seek to probe different aspects of our personality. However, such an approach cannot replace the deepest feelings that Sufis liken to 'flavors' that lead us towards the highest and most mysterious regions of our soul. In this perspective, this knowledge is first and foremost a journey, a process through which one traverses different levels of deepening self-awareness. Science and consciousness are then inseparable and combine to allow us to reach, beyond the multiple veils of our illusory identities, the source of our deepest being. Approaching this source is, according to the different paths of wisdom, to approach a state of unconditional inner happiness and freedom. 'I was between myself and myself,' says the poet, 'separated from myself by myself, and the one I truly love has never ceased to be my source and my spirit.

The question that then arises is how to better understand the premises and the specific modalities of such a journey.

Note on the artistic programme Milan Otal, artistic director

Concerts, film screenings, performances, exhibitions and confraternities: the programme for this 16th edition of the Fez Festival of Sufi Culture reflects the event's desire to promote dialogue between cultures and spiritualities. The concerts will feature musical traditions from Africa, Asia and Europe. Fatimzahra Qortobi, Abdelkader Ghayt, the maalmat from Meknès, Fatou Mint Enghdey, Senny Camara, Yahya Hussein Abdallah, Sain Zahoor, Aurélien Pascal, Marouane Hajji and I Muvrini are just some of the artists who will be inviting us to discover the beauty and depth of this music of soul-to-soul dialogue. At its heart is sama', the art of listening that permeates tasawwuf, the Sufi way.

To open the festival, the two great Oujdi singers, Fatimzahra Qortobi and Abdelkader Ghayt, will fill the Jnan Sbil park with the sound of Andalusian muwashahat, introduced by the words of actress Sophia Hadi. The magnetic Sain Zahoor (winner of the Aga Khan Music Award 2022) will come from Lahore in Pakistan to convey the message of the Sufi poets, a timeless message of love and the quest for union with the divine.

African mystical song will be particularly well represented, with the participation of Mauritanian griot Fatou Mint Enghdey, Senegalese singer Senny Camara accompanied by her kora, and the inspired Tanzanian singer Yahya Hussein Abdallah (Winner of the Aga Khan Music Award 2022).

In a bid to open up to the world's spiritualities, the festival is inviting the young cello prodigy Aurélien Pascal (Instrumental Soloist Revelation at the 2023 Victoires de la Musique Classique awards) to perform Johann Sebastian Bach's first three cello suites in the Jnan Sbil park. The huge Corsican singing group I Muvrini will be sharing its telluric vocal universe inspired by Corsican spiritual polyphonies. No syncretism here. Just a listening to sounds that have been handed down from heart to heart, in different regions and eras, and that open the heart of anyone who listens to them.

The maalmat of Meknès, heirs to a unique musical genre, will be sharing the mystical art of masmoudi to the rhythm of the gwell, the t'bla and the bendir. The brilliant singer Marouane Hajji will bring to life the century-old words of the mystical poets Al-Harraq, Al-Choustarî and Al-Busarî. Finally, in the closing concert, the Taybah ensemble will be drawing on the Syrian Chadhili repertoire to lead the ecstatic dance of the whirling dervishes and invite us to enter the Way of Love.

Throughout the festival, the Qadiriya-Boutchichiya, Wazzaniya, Sqaliya and Cherqawiya tariqas, four brotherhoods from Morocco, will be sharing their musical and ritual heritage. The Hamadcha of Fez, led by master Abderrahim Amrani Marrakchi, will be offering visitors the chance to enjoy a unique spiritual experience during a lilâ, or "spiritual night". Finally, two exhibitions will highlight the richness of contemporary Arabic calligaphy through the work of painter and psychotherapist Sami Ali and photographer Benjamin Bēni, two artists who explore the potential of this art through original and inspiring works. A retrospective of Sami Ali's work will take place at Riad Sheherazade. Benjamin Bēni and painter Mohamed Charkaoui will be exploring the thoughts of the Sufis, plunging into a visual and conceptual journey where calligraphy and photography come together to reveal a profound and plastic artistic message.

Opening night: The Religion of Love: Mysticism and Poetry With Fatima Zahra Qortobi and Abdelkader Ghayt Inan Sbil Park

The muwashshah is a poetic genre that was invented and developed by Moukaddam Ibn Mouafa of Qabra in Arab Andalusia at the end of the 10th century. This melodious, gentle song, structured in stanzas, has over time taken various forms, both in North Africa and the Middle East. In Tunisia, Algeria, and Morocco, it merges into the nouba and constitutes a common heritage for Spanish Christians, Sephardic Jews, and Muslims who work to perpetuate this music. In this opening concert, two great voices from Oujda, Fatima Zohra Qortobi and Abdelkader Ghayt, revive this ancestral musical tradition, immersing us in the world of muwashshahat where earthly and divine love coexist.




Sain Zahoor, the Transmission of Love Pakistan Inan Sbil Park

Those who had no one in this world, These sons, I have seen them grow By His grace, I have seen people cross oceans. People say that the pulsations do not soften, I have seen stones melt. Baba Bullhe Shah

Born in the village of Haveli Lakhan, in the southern Punjab of Pakistan, Sain Zahoor leaves home at the age of ten and begins to travel through Sufi shrines. His first musical inspirations arise during his visit to the Punjabi shrine of the famous 17th-century Punjabi Sufi poet, Baba Bullhe Shah, in Kasur. It is there that he meets Ustad Sain Raunka Ali and begins to learn the Sufi kalams (poems). For decades, he primarily sings in the streets or at Sufi shrines throughout the country, thus earning his living as a nomad. In 1989, Sain Zahoor performs for the first time on a concert stage at the famous All Pakistan Music Conference. Since then, he has been a regular guest at festivals in Pakistan and then abroad, especially since receiving the BBC World Music Award in 2006. The main goal of his show remains the transmission, through his magnetic voice, of the message of the Sufi poets, a timeless message that conveys love and the quest for union between human beings and the Divine Beloved.

Led by Maalma Hassana, the maalmat of Meknes perform female trance rituals and practice the art of masmoudi, long praises in honor of the Prophet and the Saints. These praises are followed by faster sections of intermediation to the rhythm of drums: the gwell (cup drums), the t'bla (small clay timbales), and the bendir (frame drum).


Concert: Fatou Mint Engdhey Mauritania Jnan Sbil Park

Fatou Mint Engdhey, inheritor of the Iggawin tradition (equivalent to African griots or Occitan troubadours), is initiated into the subtle art of the ardin, this Moorish harp whose practice is reserved for women. Her songs embody the entire memory of the Mauritanian people, drawing from both secular and sacred texts. She sings ancient poetry, the founding epics of past empires, and the tragic loves of yearning lovers, or invokes the divine love of the mystics Al-Burai and Ibn Al-Farid. Her performances have paved the way for her participation in major festivals in Mauritania and abroad.

9:00 PM Ritual: Tariqa Cherqawiya, Morocco Jnan Sbil Park

The Cherqaouia Zawiya was founded, at the same time as the city of Bejaad, by the great Sufi and apostle of Sufism in the greater Tadla region, Sheikh Sidi Bouabid Echarqi, in the second half of the 16th century. The holy city of Bejaad has become, for centuries, a beacon of civilization. Among the most illustrious saints and thinkers, we mention Sidi Salah and his son Sidi El Maati who bequeathed the famous Dakhira dedicated to the praises of the Prophet in sixty-six volumes.

Concert: Aurélien Pascal performs the Cello Suites by Johann Sebastian Bach, France Jnan Sbil Park Let me become like the angels! Cantata BWV 31, Johann Sebastian Bach

From 1717 to 1723, Bach was at the court of Coethen in the service of Prince Leopold. A fine amateur musician, Leopold demanded concerts almost every evening. It was in this context that Bach created the Cello Suites and the Partitas for solo violin. Aurélien Pascal, a young cello prodigy (First Prize and Audience Prize at the Emanuel Feuermann competition at the Berlin Philharmonie in 2014; 'Revelation Instrumental Soloist' at the Victoires de la Musique Classique 2023...), makes the sumptuous Jnan Sbil garden resonate with the first three suites of Bach.

In a play of tension, the illusion of polyphony is offered to the listener, where a single bow and a single string are enough to create an imaginary orchestra. The further one progresses in the work, the more one marvels at the poetry and humanity that emanate from it.

8:30 PM Ritual: Tariqa Wazzaniya, Morocco Jnan Sbil Park

The Wazzaniya tariqa, originating from Jazoulite (Shadhilite), was founded by Moulay Abdellah Chrif in Wazzane, a city he also founded and which is considered sacred to this day. The Wazzaniya Zawiya was also known as 'Dar Dmana' (the house of guarantee or protection) because, in addition to being a spiritual center, it also offered asylum.

Ritual: Lîla Hamadcha, Morocco Ben Youssef Cultural Complex Founded by the Saint Sidi Ali Ben Hamdouch in the 17th century, the Hamadcha brotherhood has distinguished itself by the originality of its repertoire, its mesmerizing dances, and the trancetherapy qualities of its members. They perform notably during lîla-s ('night-s'), organized at the request of individuals to bring baraka, celebrate the moussements. the moussem, a wedding, a birth, or a circumcision. The Hamadcha ritual is a space for therapy, and as such, some individuals also seek them out to experience a form of spiritual exaltation (hâl). The Hamadcha of Fez, led by master Abderrahim

Amrani Marrakchi, are distinguished by their in-depth knowledge of the repertoire and their remarkable musical qualities. During this lîla, storyteller Frédéric Calmès will immerse us in the fascinating legends of the brotherhood.

Jean-François Bernardini, his brother Alain, and their accomplices perpetuate the tradition of singing in the Corsican language around the world. Their enchanting harmonies, accompanied by guitars and traditional instruments, have captured the beauty of traditional Corsican songs without confining them to the clichés of folklore or nationalism. A vibrant testament to the island soul, i muvrini spreads a universal message of peace and unity by sharing their passion for the Corsican language and the preservation of cultural heritage. By singing in a marginalized, forbidden, and diminished language, their poetics is that of anger combined with action, imagination, and the artist concerned about the state of the world. They have forged, through more than thirty albums, a discography of incredible richness, a true bridge between Corsican culture and the rest of the world, illuminated by 8 Gold Records and 2 Victoires de la Musique. The concerts of I Muvrini are always moments of sharing a rare emotional power: their vocal universe becomes organic, almost telluric while taking on a spiritual dimension inherited from Corsican polyphony.



Taybah Ensemble and the Whirling Dervishes of Damascus, France/Syria

The Taybah Ensemble originates from the Shâdhiliyya tradition of Damascus and continues the sama' tradition in France. The suites (waslât) string together praises (anashid) to the glory of God and His Prophet, drawn from the Syrian repertoire (Great Umayyad Mosque of Damascus, zawayyas of Aleppo), as well as mystical poems exploring metaphors of love poetry. These chants are traditionally performed in the form of a spiritual concert (sama') in gatherings of remembrance (dhikr). Here, as part of the Sufi Culture Festival, their measured rhythms lead to the ecstatic dance of the whirling dervishes and invite us to enter the Path of Love.



A Frenchman born in Egypt in 1925, therapist, emeritus professor of psychology at Université Paris Cité, philosopher, painter and visual artist, translator, Sami-Ali is above all an innovative theorist of psychosomatic unity, of relational psychosomatics. His concept of unity transcends the links between the psychic and the somatic. Unity in inspiration that simultaneously unfolds on several levels: scientific, literary, and calligraphic. A space indeterminable among spaces, a boundary where the poem, touching the silence of the brush or the pen, extends into an infinity of echoes: a way of seeing the unspeakable. At the confluence of Eastern and Western cultures, he has held about thirty exhibitions, including at UNESCO in Paris (France), UNESCO in Beirut (Lebanon), and the Library of Alexandria (Egypt). He has published 33 books in the fields of art, poetry, and relational psychosomatics.






